Len Minick Memorial Combat Challenge

WILL ROGERS, GLENN SIMPSON, NEIL SIMPSON & CONRAD WON-DOLOWSKI ARE TOP FOUR

JUNE 26, 2005 - EASTHAMPTON, MA – This was the third annual Len Minick Memorial Combat Challenge held in tribute to and in memory of our good friend and fellow competitor. There was rain, on the drive in, which stopped before the first match but by the third round it was back, on and off, for the balance of the day. The weather held down attendance for this one, however, those combt faithful that made the trip enjoyed a day of very enjoyable, competitive matches.

Round one saw Will Rogers and Conrad Wondolowskii both get off to good starts posting one cut wins. In the first match of round two Will stayed hot earning a one cut win over Conrad, meanwhile Neil Simpson and Ken Hargreaves climed into contention, both, posting good round two wins. At the halfway point it was Will (1240pts), Neil (930pts) with Conrad and Ken both with 920 points. In the first match of round three Will and Ken mid aired hurting both their cumulative scores. In the next match Neil just squeaked out a win over Conrad. Glenn Simpson was flying very steady and going into round four he was also in contention. Going into the final round it was Neil (1450 pts), Will (1440pts), Glenn (1330pts), and Conrad (1120pts). In round four Conrad and Jeff Vader as well as Will and Glenn flew to one cut apiece draws. In the final match Ken got an airtime win over Neil. The final order of finish was Will (1950pts), Glenn (1840pts), Neil (1650pts) and Conrad (1630pts).

Thank You to everyone won braved the elements and made this a good contest. Thank You, in particular, to Ernie Carosella, who came out on a less then perfect day, to do the majority of the judging.





F2D News

Hi everybody - it's me again. Sorry for missing last month. Time is pretty tight right now as I'm preparing to leave for the World Championships tomorrow morning. I'll have to be brief, but they say that brevity is the soul of wit so maybe I'll still manage to drop something enlightening on you this month.

Last month, Neil mentioned in the New England Combat News that I ran out of time to write a column. To add to that, I want to fill you in on some of what's been going on for me recently. Of course a big part of that was work related, but my other primary occupation of late has been training for the upcoming World Championships. Last month I had the opportunity to join US F2D team pilot Andrey Nadein in Phliadelphia for two weekends of intense training. On the first Sunday, Aleksey Topunov of Chicago, Illinois also joined in on the effort. Aleksey will be Andrey's official mechanic in Spain.

My flying sessions with Andrey have always seemed to be quite fruitful. After a long lay off we will both show signs of rust, but very quickly get back into shape. By the end of our training together, I felt like we were both flying very solidly.

This time, we took our training to a new level stole a bit out of the old Russian training books. In particular, for each match we predetermined what each of us would be working on and carefully followed these rules throughout the session. The benefits of this method seem to be twofold. First, because we have discussed our plans in advance, there is less risk of midair. Not only does that save equipment, but it also saves time as constantly having to swap engines off of broken models can really cut down on flying time. Second, having specific goals for each match gives each pilot a purpose, a plan, a palpable measure of performance. To paraphrase Mike Willcox, the point of training is not to win every match; rather, the point is to gain more familiarity with your models, try out new tricks/ maneuvers, and to get your confidence up for a contest.

Speaking of Mike, he, I, and a few other combat pilots were interviewed by Larry Driskall for his recent Combat columns in Flying Models magazine. I've written about my views on training in the past, but Larry takes it a step further and gathers a variety of viewpoints to present to readers. I found it very interesting to read these comments, and I encourage all of you to track down those issues and read them for yourselves.

Shortly after returning from Philadelphia, I turned around and flew back to L.A. for two weeks of training with my dad Chuck Rudner (also US F2D Team Pilot) and the rest of my old crew (Rich von Lopez, Pete Athans, Don and Chris Jensen). Chuck and Rich have been practicing hard every weekend all year, and it really showed. They were both in excellent shape when I arrived. After 5 more days of flying with them, I can safely say that Chuck is in tip top shape.

All of our team members have put in a very serious effort, and have been doing everything in their power prepare for the World Championships. We should all be proud to have such a dedicated group of pilots to represent us in Spain.

I must leave now, but I hope all of you are flying a lot and getting ready for the Fall contest rush. Hope to see you all real soon,

Position in the season point standings is determined by the percentage column. The formula to determine percentage is total points accumulated divided by total possible points. Points are awarded in decending order for the first ten places in each contest (1st Place = 10pts, 2nd Place = 9pts etc.) Total possible points is the number of contests participated in multiplied by ten. Participation in no less then 50% of the New England regular season GX meets is the elegibility requirement for a season championship award.

Snakes alive! Reptile captured: Plymouth gardener encounters 9-foot python under a rhododendron

PLYMOUTH - When the call came in for a cobra on Ellisville Drive, Environmental Police Officer William Costello figured he better put boat inspections on hold and deal with the snake first.

It was actually a Burmese python, and it was big - all 9 feet and 25 pounds of it curled up and resting comfortably under a rhododendron.

Costello and Plymouth police officer Brian Stas coaxed the snake into a box and carted it away.

"I reached under the bush and grabbed the head end and the rest followed," Costello said.

Stas held the box and the two managed to get the reptile into it.

"It's so big it would never fit through a chain link fence," Costello said. "It's obviously well cared for and probably someone's pet. We'd like the owner to come and get it."

Landscaper Francis Lane was working at the Ellisville Drive home when one of his workers ran into the reptile while mulching the yard.

The worker is Brazilian and not fond of snakes. Lane at first brushed off his worker's concern thinking it was just a common garter snake until he actually saw it.

Costello said that owning the snake is legal, but he believes a permit is necessary for any snake over 4 feet.
