### Wompatuck Fall Fly-Off NEIL SIMPSON, BRIAN STAS, RICK CLARK & GLENN SIMPSON TAKE TOP FOUR SPOTS

NOVEMBER 5, 2006 – HINGHAM, MA – Again this year the Wompatuck State Forest in Hingham, Massachusetts was chosen as the site for our annual post-season contest. In addition to being a great late season Formula GX event, this post season contest has become the forum at which the top finishers in the New England season point championships receive their awards. The weather was Seasonably warm, with temperatures peaking in the fifties. There was a warm sun with little or no wind, another good day for combat. This year's event attracted nine New England pilots, to draw down the curtain on a very successful year 2006 Formula GX season.

Round one saw Rick Clark get off to the best start posting a two cut win over Brian Stas. In round two Rick mid-aired while both Neil Simpson and Brian Stas posted three cut wins. Round three started with a good match between Rick and Neil that would have ended in one cut apiece draw. except for a missed airtime by Rick. Going into round four Neil had 1750 points, Brian had 1530 points, Rick was still within striking distance as was Glenn Simpson and Jeff Vader who were flying steady and accumulating points. Early in round four Glenn flew Matt Stas to a one-cut apiece draw. In the semi-final match Rick earned a one cut win over Jeff. In the final Neil and Brian squared off in a match that ended in a one cut apiece draw. The final order of finish was Neil, Brian, Rick and Glenn.

Thank You, from everyone, to Rick Clark, who secured permission to use the site and also cd'ed the event. Also, Thanks go out to all the guys who helped judge the matches, not just on this day, but all year long. (details on page seven)

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
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### F2D News - December 2006 Mark Rudner rudner@mit.edu

The winter got off to a bit of a slow start here in New England (global warming anyone?), but the year is finally coming to a close. What have we accomplished this year? What have we learned? What are our plans/goals for the coming year?

I learned many things this year. For one, I learned the importance of maintaing a versatile flying style. Sometimes one strategy or approach may be very effective against a certain group of pilots, but against others it may not get you very far. For this reason it is very important to be adaptable -- to be willing and able to change your strategy when a hole in it is exposed. Every pilot will always have strengths and weaknesses, perhaps a preference for offense or defense, but it is important to cultivate all aspects of your flying so that you will always have options to turn to if your first plan of attack falls flat.

This year I also learned something about pitting. While I have written in the past about the importance of learning good pitting skills and have considered myself a fairly competent mechanic, I learned that there is always room for improvement. There is more to starting an engine than connecting the battery and flicking the prop one, two, several times. There is a rhythm, a feel, a finesse to it that can only be learned by experience and practice, but can greatly improve the efficiency of this procedure. It's no accident that many Russian and former Soviet mechanics start these engines regularly without any form of finger protection whatsoever.

I also witnessed the benefits of carefully constructed training routines for less experienced pilots. On several occasions throughout the year, I flew with Ken Hargreaves and led him through several instructive drills to help solidify some foundational aspects of his flying. In my eyes (you can ask him yourself for his opinion), these drills were quite successful and I saw a lot of growth in his flying over the course of the year.

For the coming year, my plans are to cultivate some new aspects of flying, and to concentrate a bit more on getting in tune with the machine itself. My hope is that these things will round out my flying and pitting skills, thus bringing me closer to having the elusive ``total package."

What about you? Where have you come from, and where are you going? How will you get there?

This Thanksgiving, I had the chance to go down to Philadelphia to spend the holiday with the families of Andrey Nadein and Alex Prokofiev. Alex is a world class pilot and class-act guy who recently moved from Moscow to the Northeast. I hope that everyone will join me in welcoming him to our group, and that you will all have a chance to meet him soon in the combat circle.

Points are awarded in decending order for the first ten places in each contest (1st Place = 10pts, 2nd Place = 9pts etc.) Total possible points is the number of contests participated in multiplied by ten. Participation in no less then 50% of the New England regular season GX meets is the elegibility requirement for a season championship award.
