

CONTEST FUND: This month we received a very generous contribution from Len Thibault, former competitor and a good friend to New England Combat... Thank you Len.








Winter Projects-Shawn and Ken Cook


Here are a few projects Shawn and I have been doing. We really should be making combat wings but this stuff has been sitting on the back burner for a long time. I like speed as well and were going to be working on a formula .40 with a rear exhaust K&B 6.5 with a AAC piston setup. For now, I figured I'd finish up a 1/2A proto I always wanted to do which is the Torky from Dale Kirn. In addition, I'm a bit of a McCoy redhead fan and I restored some engines I received from my dad. These had NO compression and didn't work at all. I picked up some parts engines and sure enough with some proper parts selection and a bit of piston lapping I have some very good running examples with new gaskets as well. I also built this Scientific Big Otto from Dan Banjock who provided me a kit. I cut out lighter wood and put Big Otto on a bit of diet. Power will be Cox Tee Dee. I used the lightest wood I had making the solid leading edge and trailing edge. All ribs were eventually lightened as well. These were early pictures.















More Winter Projects from Ken and Shawn Cook

This is a Sterling Skylark I received, I stripped all of the silkspan which by the way I will NEVER DO again. I took the entire plane apart aside from the ribs, due to the old Ambroid falling apart. All pieces re-glued and many repairs were required. I had to redo many cap strips and replace ribs, top block removed and hollowed and replaced. I could've built a new one. All controls replaced due to being extremely poor and engine crutch was severely oil soaked so K2r applications over and over followed by acetone wash. Finally oil was removed and many needed repairs were made. Power will be OS Fp.40. This was redhead McCoy powered. Last is the P-30 free flight known as the Hobbit. This was a R/N model from the early 80's. Quite expensive at the time and one that sat for many years. My father always wanted to build it. I told him I would finish it and we can both go fly it. In addition, I built a Mig -15 free flight which is absolutely awesome. Dan was very impressed with this one. Pics coming.



My Winter Projects - The Evolution of a Design

The photo at the bottom left is my trusted õCarbon Coyoteö. Itøs a foam wing design that has evolved slightly through the years, however, it is essentially the same speed limit ship that I we used for a good long time. Last winter I embarked on a project to build essentially the same airplane using F2D style open bay construction with internal controls looking to save weight, improve wing loading and fully expecting that all this would yield improved performance. I built six prototypes one of which is shown bottom right this page. I didnøt get around to serious test flying of the prototypes until November of last year after the contest season had ended. The improvement was real but quite marginal. This winter, theorizing that I reached the point of diminishing returns with reference to wing loading, I opted to try a little less wing area as well as going with less airfoil thickness at the tips all in attempt to further reduce total weight, but more importantly reduce drag hopefully allowing the airplane to return to speed quicker following maneuvers. The day after Christmas the first airplane (top left, next page) was ready. On December 27th we were without snow and the afternoon temperature approached fifty degrees. Mother Nature had given me the opportunity to test fly the new design. I was encouraged enough my the improved performance to build four more of these airplanes which are shown on the following page, in order left to right and top to bottom. By the second build I moved from conventional ribs to partial cross rib construction and then to full cross rib construction on the final three prototypes. This was a bit of a gamble as winter set in and test flying the cross rib prototypes would have to wait until spring. They seem to build marginally lighter, they are actually easier to build and seem to have similar strength with perhaps improved torsional rigidity. I hope spring test flying proves these observations to be correct. Perhaps by the time you read this the snow, here in New England, will have melted and test flying will be under way.
